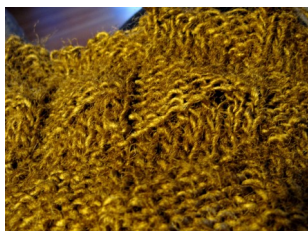
Nature's Wrapture is due out in January 2010.

"This may be the item the got the whole idea going. . . A few years ago I ran across this image and thought about recreating her skirt using a ribbon yarn. . . In keeping with the garment structure of the period, the Minoan Shrug, Surplice and Skirt will be based on rectangular shapes with interesting stitch/texture detail. . . I used a very open lace pattern in the shrug—a fun, geometric and easy to remember repeat. I hope it will be a nice contrast to a more tightly knit fabric for the surplice."



Annie used Dharma (in Thyme and Wheat, respectively) for the Shrug and Surplice, and will be using Mango Moon's Silk Ribbon for the skirt.
